- The disease continues to spread in Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone.
- The World Health Organization reported that there could be 10,000 new cases of Ebola every week by December if the virus is not contained.
- Government agencies are closely monitoring cases of Ebola in the United States.

THE RESPONSE

Government and nongovernment agencies around the world are working to contain the outbreak and treat those who are suffering. The needs increase daily as the virus spreads.
